
Happy summer to all of our wonderful volunteers!

HEALTH & WELLNESS VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHTS: CHOP & PCOM

Helping our participants lead happy, healthy lives.

In 2003, collaboration between the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP) and St. Barnabas Mission (SBM) was established. To this day, through CHOP's Homeless Health Initiative (HHI), a collection of attending physicians, nurses, doctors, dentists, social workers, and medical students volunteer at the emergency shelter where they provide children with physical exams and dental assessments that are needed for enrollment in school.

Additionally, every Thursday during the academic year, CHOP-HHI volunteers run Wellness Workshops for the women while providing Safe Physical Activity and Recreation for Kids (SPARK) at the shelter.

After seeing how valued the on-site care was for the children, outreach efforts were made to try and connect with health service providers for the women at the shelter. In 2013, SBM secured a partnership with the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) where volunteers from their Medical Student-Run Clinic began providing the mothers at SBM with primary care and health service needs.

We want to thank these incredible volunteers for providing our participants at St. Barnabas Mission with the care they need to achieve their goals and lead happy, healthy lives.

NATIONAL VOLUNTEER WEEK RECAP

We had an amazing time celebrating our passionate volunteers during National Volunteer Week.

The week began with lots of energy and enthusiasm as a group of volunteers hosted a party for the residents at St. Barnabas Mission. Throughout the week, our team visited several volunteers at their homes or places of work to deliver thank you swag bags.
